Institutions Matter: CDD Strengthens Ties with the Supreme Court

- The Center for Democracy and Human Rights (CDD) reaffirmed, on Friday, 7 November, its commitment to strengthening the Rule of Law and defending the independence of the judiciary, during a courtesy visit to the Honourable Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Mozambique, Professor Adelino Muchanga.



The CDD delegation, led by its Executive Director, Professor Adriano Nuvunga, was received in a meeting marked by cordiality and a shared conviction around a common principle: justice as a pillar of democracy and public trust.

The visit aimed to commend the Supreme Court for its role in safeguarding legality and upholding the autonomy of district courts, at a time when debate around judicial independence has regained national relevance. CDD stressed that respect for institutions and constructive dialogue are fundamental to consolidating democracy and ensuring the credibility of the justice system.

In turn, the Honourable Chief Justice highlighted the importance of collaboration between judicial institutions and civil society organizations, recog-

nizing CDD's contribution in areas such as civic education, access to justice for vulnerable communities, and the promotion of a culture of legality.

In a national context marked by significant economic and social challenges, CDD reiterated its readiness to continue cooperating with the judiciary in initiatives that promote court modernization, legal aid for low-income families, and research on public justice policies.

More than an institutional visit, the meeting represented an act of democratic maturity and a reaffirmation of the shared commitment to strengthen the institutions that uphold the Mozambican State. Justice is not merely the space of law. It is the foundation upon which national trust is built. It is on that ground that CDD has chosen to continue its work.


